

The "Historical" Churches of Christ 75th Annual National Lectureship Will Convene in the City of St. Louis, Missouri – April 20-25, 2019

he "Historical" Churches of Christ Annual National Lectureship which began in 1945 among African American churches of Christ will take place April 20-25, 2019, in the "Gateway City" of St. Louis, Missouri.

The selected theme for this convocation of gospel preachers and Christians from across the nation is entitled: "From Tragedy to Triumph: Exploring Man's Fall and God's Call to Redemption" (I Corinthians 15:55-58).

This year the Lectureship program will feature a series of homiletic messages taken from the epistles of Romans, Ephesians, Philippians, and II Corinthians; each of which correlate to the general theme.

Also, the National Lectureship in concert with the St. Louis area will honor Dr. Ralph P. Smith, Sr., Minister of the Centreville Church of Christ in East St. Louis, Illinois, for his labor among congregations throughout the brotherhood.

The Women's Division will honor Bernice Pitts of Los Angeles, California, and Dr. Opear R. Myles of Chicago, Illinois. Both of these "Sisters of Struggle" are widows of Church of Christ preachers and are considered to be "nonagenarians" having recently celebrated their ninetieth birthdays.

This year the Lectureship program will feature a series of homiletic messages taken from the epistles of Romans, Ephesians, Philippians, and II Corinthians; each of which correlate to the general theme.

Celebrating the Life and Legacy of Evangelist Cecil B. Herndon

Evangelist Cecil Bernard Herndon was born on August 2, 1945 in the city of Houston, Texas. He was educated in the Houston Independent School District and graduated in 1963 with honors from Phillis Wheatley High School. While at Wheatley he participated in football and became a legend known as "The Toe." Cecil was baptized into the body of Christ by A. D. Derek at the age of 12 at the Fifth Ward Church of Christ. At a very early age, he possessed a zeal for serving God and spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Cecil was humble and gifted to sing with the renowned group "The Untouchables." As a faithful member of the Fifth Ward Church of Christ, Cecil was afforded the opportunity to present his first sermon on January 1, 1963. At the age of 18, he then entered Southwestern Christian College and never looked back.

After graduating he entered Texas College in Tyler Texas. Cecil received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas College, a Master's degree in English from Texas A&M University at Commerce, and continued to pursue his Doctorate degree while serving congregations throughout Texas. After making the decision to engage full-time in the ministry, Cecil retired after 35 years as an Adjunct Professor from Houston Community College Systems.

Over the years, he received numerous accolades and awards. Cecil was inducted into the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., in 1972, honored as "Man of the Year," named among the Outstanding Young Men of America in 1974 and 1976, and listed among the "Who's Who in Black America" in 1982. He was also a faithful and reliable member of the Churches of Christ National Lectureship Advisory Committee.

Evangelist Cecil B. Herndon departed this earthly life surrounded by his loving family, friends, and ministerial colleagues on Saturday, August 11, 2018. He was preceded in death by his son Cecil Herndon, Jr., his mother Emma Herndon Leggett; grandparents Monroe & Gladys Herndon; and sister Barbara Ann Keptney. Left in God's care to attach importance to his remembrance are his loving and untiring wife, AnnJeannett; his devoted son Kenneth Nathaniel (Jennifer); his precious daughter ShaVonne Cecile; grandsons Kenny, Jr., Patrick and Jalen; a loving sibling Linda D. Carter (Jack, Sr.); in-laws Walter F. Jordan (Karen); Ronnie L. Jordan; Shirley Creswell (Reginald); a host of precious nieces, nephews, relatives and friends; Eastside Families along with Ministerial and Professional Colleagues. The eulogy was performed by Dr. W. F. Washington of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.
